Once again, remember; The Lord is risen. The Lord is risen indeed!



## GENERAL ASSEMBLY PASTORAL REPORT

Dear Olympic View Family:

It has been an honor and privilege to serve you these past 18 months. Enclosed is a brief report on my duties and ministry among you in these past months, since our fall General Assembly.

**Worship Services:** Since November, 2016, we are averaging 39-40 souls in attendance each Sunday morning service. Both Christmas and Easter services saw approximately 50 - 55 in attendance. Let us all continue to strive to bring more people into the worship life of our church, while also honoring and supporting our current members and visitors.

I might add, during Holy Week, we held a beautiful and peaceful Love Feast on Maundy Thursday. Approximately 32 people attended. Thanks to the volunteers who helped make it a success.

**Youth Group Ministry:** I'm continuing to assist and support Bobbi, Harriet, and the volunteers who lead our youth. As we hold our spring General Assembly, planning is going forward to

send our kids and young adults to camp at Camp Koinonia, in both June and August. Since mid winter, we are seeing a dedicated small group of youth attend church services each and every Sunday. Keep up the good work Bobbi, Harriet and volunteers.

**Community Outreach:** I'm continuing to reach out to the local community. I'll be leading the Sunday, May 21st Vespers service, at Northaven. I lead this Sunday evening service on a quarterly basis. I also attend the 6:30am Senior Men's Breakfast at Northaven. I speak to the group on a rotating quarterly basis as well.

I'm continuing to tutor two young boys, each Thursday afternoon at Olympic View Elementary. We also are "the" major neighborhood donor for the "Eagle Packs" weekend food collection program at Olympic View school. Just last week, April 18th, I dropped off 150 - 175 lbs of food. God bless all of you for supporting this ongoing food drive.

A final point: I'm also one of four people on the search committee charged with finding a new management team for Camp Koinonia. Mike and Nancy are moving on, as of September 30th. In terms of community outreach, I will continue to seek ways that I/we can engage the community through loving acts of work and witness in the neighborhood.

**Pastoral Ministry:** I continue to call on shut-in's and nursing home residents. Of late, we now have two members in Hospice care. Jimmy Barnes and Dorsey Harris. I visit them regularly. As always, I'm always available to visit or counsel anyone in need, as their needs arise.

In conclusion, since last November, time has really flown by! During whatever remaining time I'm here as your Interim Pastor, I remain committed to serving you good folks. From the bottom of my heart, I thank you all for the privilege of serving you.

## OLYMPIC VIEW YOUTH MINISTRY REPORT

### Olympic View Community Church of the Brethren

Since November, the youth have had many wonderful gatherings together and opportunities to learn and grow in community. This year, we helped out again with the shopping and packing of Thanksgiving baskets for needy families.

In December, Charles Walker and Pastor Jeff shared about what it was like growing up black during the Civil Rights era, and Liz Lindley talked about growing up in a "sundown town" in Kansas. Also in December, Monica attended a trauma stewardship workshop at the University of Washington and we have been strategizing ways to continue sharing what she learned; one exercise that we have added is 60 seconds of silence to calm and center ourselves before we begin our devotions.

In January, Prof. Wes Howard-Brook of Seattle University and Lynn FitzHugh of the Faith Action Climate Team, shared about their experiences of committing civil disobedience. We have gone on some field trips - to the Museum of Flight in January, and the Seattle Art Museum in February for the Jacob Lawrence Great Migration exhibit, taking advantage of Free First Thursdays.

We celebrated Black History Month by passing out slips of paper with the names of

African-American heroes and heroines, and inviting the youth to share what they knew about each one. Also in February, Amy Stapleton, recruiter at Shoreline Community College, came and talked to us about the programs there, and as a result we already have one student participating in the CEO program at Shoreline, with more interested in doing so. Another career and education talk was given by Kim Collins, who shared about how she became a journeyman carpenter and how to get involved in the trades. We plan to welcome Kim back for a pre-apprenticeship class and cooperative building of a tiny house for the homeless.

At the beginning of Lent, we had a service of anointing, with 15 youth, including some who were there for their first or second time, receiving anointing. We've been taking advantage of longer daylight and warmer temperatures, playing basketball on the elementary school playground across the street, and we're getting ready for Brethren National Youth Sunday on May 7!

Thank you for all your prayers and support, and especially for continuing to welcome the youth and get to know them on Sunday mornings.

He says in verse 35 “For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in, I needed clothes and you clothed me, I was sick and you looked after me, I was in prison and you visited me.” and then he sums it up in verse 40 “I tell you the truth, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers of mine, you did for me.”

In other words, we are to help those in need wherever they are, and whatever the need. Our special outreach is exactly for that purpose. Every month we focus on a non-profit organization or a special giving project which is dear to the ministry and mission of the church.
