Annual Conference 2018 takes place at the Duke Energy Convention Center in Cincinnati, Ohio, on July 4-8. The theme is "Living Parables" (Matthew 9:35-38).

Our lives as living parables

"Living Parables" is a foundational call to be involved with the ministries of Jesus. It calls us to work for peace, reconciliation, and transformation of all things, visible and invisible. As living parables, Christ calls us to learn how to share our lives in grace with others and our sharing should be a source of grace for others. This kind of sharing is not about telling information, but being present in a world that so desperately needs to see Christ in action.

We Brethren, at our best, have been able to be present when disaster strikes. "Living Parables" takes us beyond providing material resources, to share our personal story of God at work in our lives-individually, through the church community of believers, and in the world. As seen through Jesus' actions

in Matthew 9:35: "Jesus went through all the towns and villages, teaching in their synagogues, proclaiming the good news of the kingdom and healing every disease and sickness."

NEWS FROM THE SEATTLE CHRISTIAN COMMUNITY INITIATIVE

We have been celebrating the Services and Sacraments of the Christian Community Movement for Religious Renewal in the Seattle area since Michaelmas, of 2000; and we have been holding the Community Devotional Lay Service since 1995.

For the Seattle Christian Community Initiative, the Olympic View Community Church has now become our 'Home Away from Home.'

In Seattle we celebrate the Christian Community Services on Saturday mornings, as we share a Reverend from a full-time community, so we always have a visiting Reverend from another congregation. The Seattle initiative tries to serve the community here through offering a service during 6 of the 7 major festival times. And during those times when we cannot have a service, or for the in-between times, we offer a monthly 'Community Devotional Lay Service,' or Lay service which is based on community participation.

The Christian Community was founded on September 16, 1922 by Rudolf Steiner when others asked for help towards creating Religious Renewal that can move humanity into the future. Each community group is financially independent and there is no established dogma, just the belief in the 'Resurrected Christ' as the source of human renewal and growth.
