

SUMMER CAMP INFORMATION

Summer Camp for grade school and Middle/Junior High youth (3rd to 9th grades) is at Camp Koinonia from June 28th to July 3. Initial registration is online. A packet of information about the camp as well as the medical release form will then be sent after registering. **Register by June 15.** Cost is \$200 for the week. Scholarships are available.

Summer Camp for High School youth will be at Gwinwood at the DOC camp July 14 - 20. Cost is \$300. **Registration deadline is June 24.** Registration can be done by paper or online. Our summer camp will take place June 28-July 3, 2019. It will be 6 days, 5 nights and children will sleep in bunk beds. We are accepting a limited number of registrations for 3rd—9th grade campers.
