

Church Protocol for Use of the Sanctuary in Support of Phase 2 Policy

- When attending a worship service, the entrance on the 5th avenue side by the church library will be used for entering and leaving the church.
- All attendees must be registered on an attendance log with contact info
 - This will show that the total count of attendees less than 50
 - This will enable us to contact all attendees if a person tests positive for COVID
- Church greeter will check temperatures and potential symptoms of each person as they arrive
- Church will mark seating to maintain a 6-foot distance for seats in all directions. Family members may sit together
- Church will require face masks inside the church building at all times
 - Attendees need to bring and wear their own face masks
 - The church will provide single-use face masks for those who do not bring their own
 - Medical grade masks are preferred for vulnerable individuals and people over 60
- Church will provide hand sanitizer in the narthex and access to bathrooms for hand-washing
 - Hand sanitizer will be 70% alcohol
 - No more than two people in the bathroom at the same time
 - Social distancing must be maintained by staying 6 feet apart in bathrooms
- Janitorial schedule requires wipe down of following areas between services:
 - Pulpit and lecterns
 - Microphones
 - Soundboard
 - Wooden edges of pews
 - Seating areas of pews that were used during the service
 - Bathrooms: with a antimicrobial towelette or ethanol spray, wipe:
 - Door handle (outside)
 - Door handle (inside)
 - Faucets in sink
 - Toilet handles
 - Bathroom stall latches
 - Bathroom stall doors
 - Waste can lids

Additional Church Policies to Prevent Spread of COVID-19

- Communion will be prepared with single servings that are sealed beforehand.
- Communion will be distributed using tongs or gloves.
- Passing of the peace must be from a distance, bow or gesture to the other person from 6 feet away.
- Weather permitting, open windows during the service to allow circulation of fresh air.
- The congregation will not be singing at this time as singing has been shown to be a very effective way to transmit of the COVID-9 virus.
- All bibles, hymnals, donation envelopes, pencils, etc. will be removed from the pew racks.
- If somebody tests positive for COVID-19 within 1 week of attending a service, the church will work with state contact tracers to identify and contact all attendees of that service.
- IF YOU ARE SICK, PLEASE STAY HOME!
- Church will provide a clinical IR thermometer (touchless) to test staff for fever.
- Church will provide training guidelines so procedures are consistent and clear.

Washington State COVID-19 Policy

Phase 1 – Outdoor Services Are Permitted

- Drive-in: people need to stay in their cars
- People need to maintain 6 foot distance at all times outdoors

Phase 2 – Indoor Services Are Permitted

- Restricted to the lesser of: less than 25% capacity or less than 50 individuals (not counting staff)
- Strongly encouraged to keep an attendance log for contact tracing purposes
- Check staff for fever upon arrival at the church
- Always maintain 6-foot distance between all congregants
- Face coverings are required
- Handwashing supplies and gloves must be available
- Cleaning schedule must disinfect areas that have been touched and seating areas of occupied pews
- Staff Training
