On September 16th and 17th, we met virtually for our annual District Conference for the Pacific Northwest District of the Church of the Brethren. While we miss the camaraderie of gathering face to face, many more can participate that may not be able to travel the distances involved to meet in person.

Our gathering was split into two days. We started Friday evening with a time of Q&A with General Secretary David Steele from the denomination, followed by a time of worship and fellowship featuring worship elements from various congregations, capped off by a reflection shared by newly ordained minister Samuel Brackett, from the Springfield congregation in Oregon. Saturday began with a time of sharing by the different congregations of our district, followed by a time of Q&A time with our Annual Conference moderator Tim McElwee and the various Church of the Brethren agencies present.

The afternoon included our business session. Several items were up for consideration and action:
